

Flood clean up begins in Colorado

Over 30 volunteers began their day working at Beth-El Mennonite Church in Colorado Springs, CO, cleaning up the parking lot which was covered with rock, mulch and mud after the floodwaters receded.

In the afternoon they helped Ms. Donna remove her wet and destroyed belongings from her flooded house. Ms. Donna made a note on the job card that she signed at the end of the day, "These kids are amazing leaders and hope for our community." Before the job started she said that she was mad at God, but by the end of the day she asked to pray with us and praised God for the young people that helped her clean up her house.

Along with other clean up work, MDS volunteers will go to the Sylvan Dale Ranch to do chainsaw work on downed trees, demolition work on severely damaged buildings and dig out four feet of silt from buildings along the river bank. In 1976 the owners of the Sylvan Dale Ranch hosted MDS volunteers as they worked to clean up after historic flooding that year. The ranch was used as the MDS headquarters for the flood recovery in that area.

As additional plans for clean up are made and volunteer needs are known, the MDS website will be updated.
