TORNADO CLEAN UP IN MIDWEST

Local MDS volunteers have been cleaning up debris in communities in Illinois and Indiana that were hit by tornados on Nov. 17. The response from local volunteers has been abundant and volunteers from outside the area are currently not needed.

Disaster: 2011 Floods

Ms. Jamie is pleased with the installation of her kitchen and bathroom cabinets. The laminate flooring is completely laid and the vinyl has been put on the kitchen, bath and entrance halls. Doors have been stained, the glossy polyurethane applied and all of them hung. The basement of Ms. Carolyn's house has all the drywall in and much of the taping completed. Two rooms have been painted with the primer. The basement bathroom has the tub installed. Clara and Jeff continue to work alongside of the crew at their house. Drywall and insulation was brought in and is now being installed in the house. The electrician has completed the rough-in.

Weather turned bad this week but we did manage to use eight energetic volunteers to complete a roof job for Ms. Donna. The job began by removing four to five layers of shingles before new plywood could be installed, followed by shingles on a rainy Tuesday. The crew worked well into the night to ensure the roof would stay dry.
