BRAITHWAITE, LOUISIANA - Disaster: 2012 Hurricane Isaac

We completed repairs on three homes this week in addition to working on the new home for Ms. Lillie Mae. The whole group worked at Mr. Kal's house on Monday, installing an exterior door and skirting on the exterior of his mobile home. A section of a damaged interior wall was also replaced. We were able to complete the roof cap on Ms. Lanore's house and fix an electrical problem at Ms. Brenda's house.

CRISFIELD, MARYLAND - Disaster: 2012 Hurricane Sandy

We had an energetic group this week from Bluffton, OH, that stepped right in and did the necessary little things without complaint. Little things like breaking up concrete, cleaning debris, and going back to the job site late in the evening to brush drying concrete. They almost completed a complex wheelchair ramp that incorporated an existing elevated deck under which lives a pot-belled pig. A new build will be started next week.

DULUTH, MINNESOTA - Disaster: 2013 Floods

Two different groups arrived this weekend, one from Manitoba, and the other from the Minneapolis area. They brought many skills with them to help us with the finish-up stages of three homes. At Mr. Ray's house volunteers continued with finishing the trim work. The crew installed door casing and base, and worked on countertops at Ms. Pat's house, then finished the framing and window installation at Mr. Eric's house.

FAR ROCKAWAY, NEW YORK - Disaster: 2012 Hurricane Sandy

This week's group of 20 volunteers joined us from Saskatchewan, Canada. They accomplished many things at several houses. At Ms. Josephine's house, some framing was done, doors were customized and installed, two sump pumps were installed (which required a lot of concrete work), work was done on the stairs, trim installation was finished, the drop ceiling was installed and painting was done.

HATTIESBURG, MISSISSIPPI - Disaster: 2013 Tornados

Bernie and Jake completed the plumbing. The bedrooms are ready for paint and most of the other mudding is nearing completion. On Friday we passed the plumbing inspection so now we can close in the rest of the walls.

HIGH RIVER, ALBERTA - Disaster: 2013 Flood

Work continues at Mr. Daniel and Mrs. Krystal's house. Volunteers carried out extensive framing work and helped the owner with electrical and plumbing renovations and most of the drywall hanging is completed and ready for finishing. Work at Mrs. Kat and Mr. Max's house started with removing plaster from main floor walls. A highlight of the past week was having Mrs. Kat and Mr. Max share with the volunteers about their experience going through the flood and recovering from it

SAYREVILLE, NEW JERSEY - Disaster: 2012 Hurricane Sandy

At Mr. Vasily's house the ceramic tile flooring in the dining room was started and laminate flooring was laid in the living room. Sub-flooring was put in the kitchen and we are waiting for delivery of the kitchen cabinets. Volunteers finished painting the entire house; all three levels. Volunteers also tore out flooring and installed a sub-floor and then vinyl flooring at Ms. Shirley's house.
