"How Silently, How Silently, the Wondrous Gift Is Given"

Hearing people live in a noisy and visually impoverished world, but Scripture invites us into holy silence. "For God alone, O my soul, wait in silence, for my hope is from him" (Psalm 62:5). "The Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him" (Habakkuk 2:20).

Because of a partnership with a Deaf church in eSwatini, the members of First Deaf Church have been exploring ways to communicate across language barriers through mime and gesture. That work was the inspiration for this program.

First Deaf Church would like to share glimpses of our visually rich world with our hearing brothers and sisters. As you watch people miming Bible verses, you are invited to guess which verse is being communicated. At the end of each mimed verse, a slide will give the verse in English, then you will see the miming again. In each of the Christmas songs we sing today, hearing people are invited to sing the one verse of the song that is in the program, while watching the gestures and visual cues that communicate the song's meaning. Then, the piano and singing will fall silent, as the verse is repeated a second time with only gestures and visual cues that reverberate with meaning.

Those who desire to do so may put offerings in either of two boxes, labeled Witmer Heights and First Deaf, which are on the table at the back of the sanctuary.

~Advent is a season observed in most Christian denominations as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at the Second Coming. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year in Western Christianity. The name was adopted from Latin adventus "coming; arrival", translating Greek parousia from the New Testament, originally referring to the Second Coming.

This year Witmer Heights is following the advent theme "How will we know?" which began December 3 Following are the themes for the next two Sundays.

Advent Theme Dec. 10: How will we know...what now? Summary statement – While we may sometimes feel discouraged or uncertain

about when or how God will act, like those in our Scriptures, we are called to live and move in the world as God's people. Even as we wonder "How long?," we begin to ask "What shall we do while we wait?"

~Advent Theme Dec. 17: How will we know...what next?

Summary statement - One of the markers of a maturing faith is the willingness to sit with questions, often for a long time, sometimes for a lifetime. Even without answers, living with our questions is part of what shapes us as people of God. How do we find hope and joy in the questions of faith that may lead not to answers, but to more questions?
